**Clinical Pastoral Education is a clinical program of 400 hours of supervised pastoral care in an accredited clinical setting (e.g., parish, hospital, or other institution) with a certified supervisor of ACPE. Students must have prior approval from Dr. Wade Rowatt, Professor of Pastoral Care, and ACPE Supervisor, in order to enroll.

Adjunct Faculty Notes

Rev. Amber Inscore Essick (M.Div., George W. Truett Theological Seminary, Baylor University; A.A., B.S., Gardner-Webb University) is Co-Pastor of Port Royal Baptist Church in Henry County, KY.

Rev. Laurie Brock (B.S., University of Southern Mississippi; J.D., University of Alabama; M.Div., The General Seminary of the Episcopal Church) is Rector of St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Lexington. She is an Alabama native, the author of *Where God Hides Holiness*, blogs at www.DirtySexyMinistry.com, and is a frequent contributor to books and online spirituality resources. She's also an avid equestrian and lets horses teach her about God, joy, and patience. Before coming to St. Michael's, she served churches in Mobile, Alabama and Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Jim Holladay (B.A., Samford University; M.Div. and D.Min., The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary) is Senior Pastor of Lyndon Baptist Church in Louisville, KY. He has taught adjunctively with BSK and with Bellarmine University.

Greg Earwood (B.A. Mississippi College; M.Div., Ph.D, The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary), retired, was the founding President of Baptist Seminary of Kentucky. Prior to his service at BSK, he was pastor of several churches in Kentucky, including churches in Louisville, Murray, and Georgetown.

Elective Course Descriptions

PRC 609 Preaching Practicum – Credit 3 hours

This course will be a laboratory where students will write and preach as many sermons as possible during the length of a semester. The goal is the significant improvement of the students' skills in research, preparation, and delivery of sermons. Special attention will be given to pastoral preaching in both predictable and crisis situations.

Prerequisite: PRC 601

PAC 611 Psychology of Religious Experience – Credit 3 hours

This course explores the psychology of religious experience, spiritual formation, and transformation. Biblical/theological foundations are studied together with research in the fields of psychology of religion and social psychology. Attention will be given to students' religious experiences as well as the ministry of guiding, sustaining, and interpreting the religious experiences of others. Students will be expected to participate in a variety of case studies and personal learning encounters in class.

Prerequisite: PAC 601 or PAC 609

OTS 679 The Psalms in the Life of the Church – Credit 3 hours

A study of the book of Psalms, with attention to their critical analysis as well as to their use in Christian devotion and worship.

Prerequisite: BIB 501
