Elective Course Descriptions

January 2019

SPF 603 Monasticism Old and New – Credit 3 hours

An introductory and experiential course designed to expose students to a variety of Christian monastic movements. Special attention will be given to the biblical, historical, and theological foundations for Christian monasticism. Students will reflect on the ways congregations and ministers can learn from the breadth and depth of the Christian monastic tradition. Students will also gain experience writing and living under a rule during the semester.

CHS 621 Church Communications: Giving Voice to Mission – Credit 3 hours

In our media-saturated culture, a church's voice can still be present. These are some of the questions explored in this course: What is our attention & information culture and what challenges and opportunities does it pose for spirituality and community? What is your church's "voice"? What media/connections are available and how might a church leverage these? The course will also look at best practices around branding and public relations.

PAC 605 Pastoral Care with Small Groups: Dynamics and Techniques – Credit 3 hours

This course is designed to address the pastoral care and counseling needs of a congregation from a small group perspective. Students will learn the theories, techniques, principles of leadership, and process of small groups. Various types of groups will include Bible study, support, recovery, educational, self-help, and counseling activities.) (*Prerequisites: PAC 601 or PAC 609*)
